#### Back to Basics: Ensuring Board Actions are Supported by Statutory Authority by Ross M. Williamson, Local Government Law Group P.C.

For this article, we are going all the way back to the very start to reexamine the foundation of Board authority. The very first question a Board should ask before acting is whether the Board has the authority to take the proposed action. This article is a reminder to examine this most basic of questions – a question that can easily be overlooked during the process of debating important policy issues that come before the Board.

Special districts are creatures of state statute and may only exercise the authority granted by statute. For fire districts, the Oregon Legislature adopted ORS Chapter 478 to provide the necessary statutory authority for fire districts to operate. ORS Chapter 478 is known as the "principal act" for fire districts. In addition to ORS Chapter 478, fire districts are also granted additional authority in other provisions of state statute. For example, ORS Chapter 198 provides general regulatory and procedural authority to all special districts, including fire districts.

To illustrate the concept of the limited nature of special district authority, it is useful to review an example. The preeminent case in this area of Oregon law is the 1976 case, Harrison v. Port of Cascade Locks (27 Or App 377). In the Harrison case, the Port of Cascade Locks sought to initiate a construction project that would bring revenue and visitors into the community of Cascade Locks. The idea consisted of the Port constructing a tramway that would take visitors up the Columbia Gorge and into the Mt. Hood National Forest. The plan was challenged in court, with plaintiffs arguing that the Port lacked the authority to build a tramway for recreational and tourism purposes. The Port defended its actions by pointing to its own principal act, ORS Chapter 777, which specifically identified the authority of port districts to build "tramways." When the case got to the Oregon Court of Appeals, the court recognized that ORS Chapter 777 granted authority for port districts to build tramways. But that did not answer the full question for the Court. In ruling against the Port of Cascade Locks, the Court of Appeals determined that the Port may build tramways, but only if the tramway furthers a legitimate port activity or purpose authorized by law. Since the purpose of the proposed tramway was for recreation and tourism, not commercial or freight purposes, the Court of Appeals determined that the Port of Cascade Locks lacked authority for its planned tramway project.

The *Harrison* case teaches us that special districts are public agencies authorized by the legislature to carry out only certain limited functions. Thus, a fire district is limited in its powers and functions to those activities that are specifically delegated to it by the Oregon Legislature in statute or to those activities that are necessary to carry out the statutory authority. While cities and counties have broad authority that is liberally construed to authorize action, a fire district's authority is limited to those powers delegated in state law. When interpreting grants of authority to special districts, Oregon courts "strictly construe" such delegations – meaning that questions of authority are resolved against the grant of broad authority. Stated another way, fire districts are limited purpose government agencies – providing only the limited services that are allowed by state statute.

A fire district also has certain "implied authority." This means that when a fire district is acting under a delegation of authority granted by ORS Chapter 478, the fire district can do such things that are implied by the grant of authority. Implied authority is the power to do such things that are necessary to carry out the power granted by statute. For example, being authorized by state statute to build a fire station means that the fire district also has the implied authority to purchase all the things necessary to construct and maintain the fire station, such as building materials and office equipment.

In looking at the fire district principal act, the Oregon Legislature granted only finite authority to fire district Boards. Under ORS Chapter 478, some of the primary grants of authority include the power to:

- Purchase property for fire stations. ORS 478.260 (2).
- Purchase apparatus and equipment for fire-fighting purposes. ORS 478.260(2).
- Create water storage reservoirs for fire-fighting purposes. ORS 478.260(2).
- Acquire real property to create fire evacuation routes. ORS 478.260(3).
- Acquire and operate emergency medical equipment and vehicles. ORS 478.260(4).
- Cooperate with other agencies to create a communication system for fire prevention. ORS 478.305(1).
- Cooperate with other agencies to operate a hazardous material response team. ORS 478.308 (1).
- Adopt ordinances to create fees for services. ORS 478.410(4).

To conclude this look at the basics of Board authority, we are left with one question that should be asked when a Board is considering a new action: Are we authorized to act? In answering this question, it is important to remember the lesson from the *Harrison* case – not only does the authority need to be clearly identified in statute, but the purpose of the action must fit within the purpose of the fire district. If clear statutory authority and a fire service purpose cannot be identified for the action, then it is a good idea to seek further advice.
